Risk Assessment

Hazard	Level of Risk	Who might be Harmed	How risk should be controlled
Journey to and from school	L	Children Adults	Coaches should park by Great Cressingham church and the children should walk to the school on the pavement. There is a 30 M.P.H. speed limit and little traffic but the children may be excited and should be closely supervised
Injury on school building or contents	M	Children Adults	The school is regularly checked for hazards but we require children to be supervised by their accompanying adults at all times
Fire from oil Lamp or Coal tortoise stove	L	Children	Children to move from area while lamp is being lit. Great Cressingham School staff to supervise children near stove. Fire extinguishers kept beside stove.
Children getting lost	L	Children	The site is secure and there is a high level bolt on the street entrance
Playground activities	M	Children	Bowling metal hoops carries a risk of tripping or falling. It must only be done on the soft grass of the meadow. Accompanying adults must ensure the children do not have trailing shoelaces. All playground activities must be supervised by accompanying adults
Toilets	L	Children	Small children should be told not to lock the door if it is thought they might be unable to unlock it.
Lunch	L	Children	On fine days visitors eat outside. Teachers must be prepared for insect bites There is soap and cold running water for hand washing
Weather	M	Children Adults	The school is considerably colder in winter than modern schools. It is essential for health and for the enjoyment of the visit that everyone wears appropriately warm clothes
Fire	L	Children Adults	There is an exit at each end of the building and in the event of fire visitors should assemble in the meadow.

The visit would fall into the low risk category.
